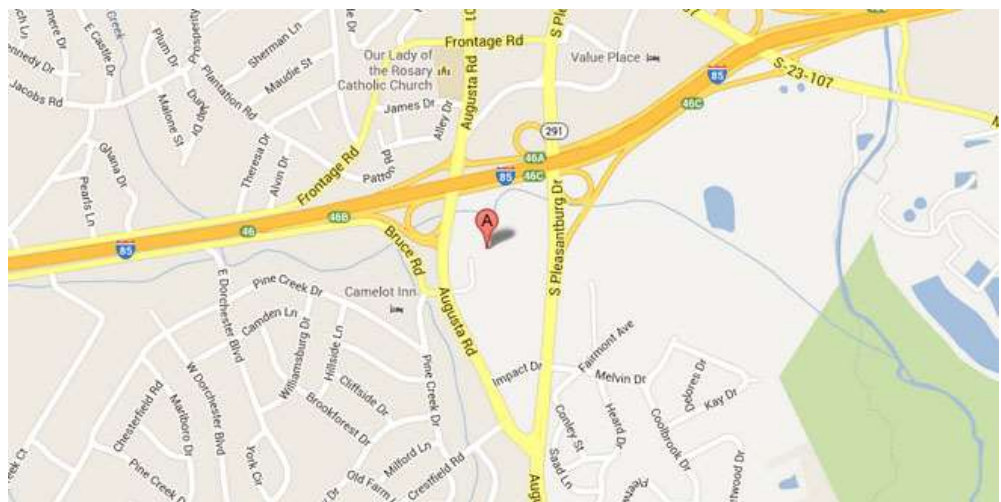
July Meeting Location

We have a New Partnership for JULY 2014, PIEDMONT KENNEL CLUB

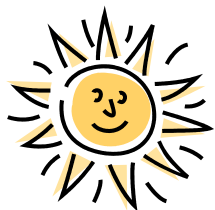

77°	- 125°
86°	- 135°
87°	- 143°

*These temperature correlations represent worst scenario variables; direct sun, no wind, very low humidity, and high radiant energy.

South Carolina Foothills Search and Rescue K-9 Unit receives American Kennel Club CAR Canine Support and Relief Fund grant.

Created to honor the work of search and rescue K-9s who bravely served in the aftermath of 9/11, our American Kennel Club Companion Animal Recovery (CAR) Canine Relief Fund has donated 4 million dollars to local search and rescue teams.

American Kennel Club affiliated clubs like the Greenville Kennel Club are presenting grants to 140 search and rescue groups in 45 states.

Since Greenville Kennel Club member Erin Cronin-Webb is this month's Artist Guild featured artist, it was the perfect time for the Artist Guild and the Greenville Kennel Club to come together to celebrate with our local honorees: Cheri Milan and K-9 Chance, Dave Milan and K-9 Fresko, Brent Parker and K-9 Ralph, Belinda Martin and K-9 Joey, Deborah Meegan and K-9 Ziva and Ellen Parker and K-9 Sandy. Also lending support were members of the Greenville Sheriff's K-9 unit.

The Greenville Kennel Club proudly supports these K-9 teams. The unique talents of these highly trained dogs and their handlers often make the difference between life and death. Team volunteers rely totally on grants and other funding for their supplies and certification training. It is surprising to know search and rescue teams pay all of their own expenses as they are volunteering out of love for the joy of serving others.

The works of Erin Cronin-Webb, celebrating the unique bond between humans and canines will remain on display at the artist guild gallery, 200 N. Main Street for the next month with a portion of the proceeds from the sale of her paintings going to the South Carolina Foothills Search and Rescue.
